VOTING STATISTICS

In the first round of balloting elections were conducted in 20 races. 57% of the eligible schools voted compared to 29% last year. Run-off elections were required in 8 of the first round elections. In the second round of elections (first round of run-off elections) 59% of the eligible schools voted. A second run-off election was required in 2 of the second round elections. In the third round of elections (second round of run-off elections) 57% of the eligible schools voted.

More than 93% of the available seats had candidates.

The Board of Directors will need to fill only 3 Representative Assembly seats compared to 18 last year.
