FHSAA Rules Clinics

FHSAA Bylaw 10.2.1: “Each member school shall be represented by its head coach for the sport at an annual rules clinic sponsored by the Association in each sport in which it sponsors a program, provided rules clinics are conducted in that sport. Failure to comply with this requirement may be penalized by the Board of Directors.”

2002 FHSAA Swimming & Diving Program General Guidelines, Regulations, Policies and Procedures

In accordance with Article 9 of the Bylaws, the following guidelines, regulations, policies and procedures governing the 2002 Swimming & Diving Program have been approved by the Board of Directors. They apply to all regular season contests as well as the FHSAA State Series unless otherwise modified or superseded by the terms and conditions approved for the State Series. Substantive changes for the 2002-03 school year are shaded.

[The FHSAA utilizes a standardized calendar in which the weeks of the year are numbered. This ensures consistent dates from year to year. Week 1 begins with the first Sunday in July. Thanksgiving always falls in Week 21.]

[The forms referenced in this manual are provided in the 2002-03 FHSAA Forms Book, a copy of which has been provided to all member schools, as well as on the FHSAA web site (www.fhsaa.org) as downloadable PDF and/or Word documents.]

1.000 – Eligibility of Student-Athletes

1.010 CERTIFICATION OF ELIGIBILITY

Only student-athletes eligible under Bylaw 11, as well as guidelines, regulations, policies and procedures governing student eligibility that have been adopted by the Board of Directors, may represent member schools in interscholastic competition. In accordance with Bylaw 11.13.1, member schools are required to certify the eligibility of their student-athletes before they participate and to withhold ineligible student-athletes from all interscholastic competition. See Appendix A for FHSAA Eligibility Rules-in-Brief.

1.020 USE OF INELIGIBLE STUDENT-ATHLETE

If an ineligible student-athlete is accidentally or intentionally permitted to participate in an interscholastic contest, forfeit of the contest and honors shall be automatic and mandatory.

2.000 – Season Limitations

2.010 PRACTICE

Organized practice shall begin not earlier than Monday of Week 6 (Aug. 12, 2002) and shall end not later than Saturday of Week 20 (Nov. 23, 2002).

2.020 COMPETITION

The first regular season contest shall be held not earlier than Monday of Week 9 (Sept. 2, 2002). The final regular season contest shall be held not later than Tuesday of Week 19 (Nov. 12, 2002).

3.000 – Team Limitations

3.010 SEASON

A team shall not, in any one season, participate in more than 15 meets exclusive of those

meets held as part of the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series.

3.020 WEEK

3.021 A team shall compete in not more than three (3) different meets during a school week. Only one (1) of these meets may cause a loss of time from school.

3.022 Meets must be completed in one (1) day unless the second day of the meet is not a school day. This provision may be waived by the Commissioner to accommodate meets held as part of the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series.

3.023 No interscholastic athletic contest may be held on a Sunday except under emergency conditions in tournaments or meets that are approved by the Commissioner or the Board of Directors. The conduct of practice sessions of any kind on a Sunday is prohibited.

4.000 – Student Limitations

4.010 SEASON

A student shall participate in not more than 15 meets in any one season, exclusive of those meets held as part of the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series.

4.020 WEEK

A student shall participate in no more than three (3) meets in any one week. Only one (1) of these meets may cause a loss of time from school.

5.000 – Eligible Opponents

5.001 Member schools may engage in regular season competition only with schools that are full or affiliate members of this Association, or out-of-state schools that are members of associations which regulate interscholastic athletic competition within their respective states, regardless of whether such associations are members of the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS). Out-of-state schools, however, must have eligibility guidelines comparable to those of the FHSAA, and must have an established season of competition in the sport that is concurrent with that of the FHSAA. Competition with out-of-state schools, in some cases, may require the approval of the NFHS. See Appendix B for NFHS regulations on interstate and international competitions.

5.002 The “Contract for Interscholastic Athletic Contest” (Form AT1) is required for all regular season contests.

5.003 Practice games, exhibition games, non-contract games and scrimmage games with other schools, groups, alumni or league teams are strictly prohibited. All such games or sessions shall be on an intra-squad basis. Non-squad members may not participate in any team practice, game or contest.

6.000 – Invitational Meets

6.001 All invitational meets (conference, county, league, etc.) involving three (3) or more schools must have the approval of the FHSAA Office. The “Application for Approval of Multi-School Athletic Event” (Form AT2) must be submitted not less than 30 days in advance of the first day of the meet to avoid a late fee of \$50. No approval is required for regular season meets (dual, tri, quad, etc.) regardless of the number of participating teams.

6.002 No junior varsity, junior high or other sub-varsity team may participate in a meet

involving a varsity team. Junior varsity, junior high and other sub-varsity meets, if held, must be held as separate events.

6.003 The FHSAA shall receive eight (8) percent of the gross receipts of all invitational swimming & diving meets. Gross receipts include revenue derived from gate receipts and entry fees. The complete “FHSAA Financial Report Form for Invitational Tournament & Meet, Jamboree and Postseason Football Bowl Game” (Form FN1) must be submitted by the host school so that it is received in the FHSAA Office, as well as by all participating schools, within three weeks (21 calendar days) of the event. Payment of profit shares due participating schools and the FHSAA must be included with the report. If the financial report is not received in the FHSAA Office within 30 calendar days, a late filing fee of \$50 will be assessed. See Appendix C for “Guidelines on Filing of Financial Reports and Payment or Revenue Shares.”

6.004 Certain invitational meets involving out-of-state schools may require the approval of the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS). See Appendix B for NFHS regulations on interstate and international competitions.

7.000 – Rules of Competition

7.010 MEET RULES

Rules as set forth in the NFHS Swimming & Diving Rules Book, unless set aside by FHSAA regulation, shall apply in all swimming & diving meets.

7.020 FHSAA MODIFICATIONS

The following modifications to NFHS Rules have been adopted by the FHSAA Board of Directors:

Rule	Modification
2-2-2, 2-7-2	WATER DEPTH: In pools with a water depth at the starting end of less than five (5) feet, the start for all swimming events for all contestants must begin in the water. There will be no variances. In pools with a water depth of five (5) feet or more, starting platforms may be used in accordance with National Federation rules.
3-1-1	ENTRIES BY TEAMS: Each team will be allowed a maximum of two entries per individual event and relay event in a pool with five lanes or less; a maximum of three entries per individual event and relay event in a pool with six or seven lanes; and a maximum of four entries per individual event and relay event in a pool with eight lanes or more. Only two relay teams may score for each team in each relay event.
3-2-1	ENTRIES BY INDIVIDUALS: A competitor will be permitted to enter a maximum of four (4) events, no more than two (2) of which may be individual events. Prelims and finals are considered the same meet. If, however, a swimmer competes in only three (3) events in prelims, he/she could compete in those three events as well as an additional relay in finals provided he/she was designated on that relay entry card. EXHIBITIONS: Exhibition swimming & diving and/or practice diving during a meet is strictly prohibited. Only those students who are properly entered may participate in a swimming and/or diving event. Extra lanes may not be used by students who are not entered in an event.
3-2-2	RELAY CARDS: Coaches may list up to eight competitors' names on the relay entry card and participation in that relay will be limited only to those individuals whose names are listed.
3-3-1	UNIFORMS: Any uniform that is used by a swimmer must cover ALL of the buttocks and must be made of a material that does not become transparent

when wet. Any competitor in violation of this rule will not be allowed to enter into competition until the offending attire is replaced. If a competitor is found in violation of this rule after entering an event, the competitor will be disqualified from that event and will not be allowed to participate further until the offending attire is replaced.

8-1-1,2,3,4,5,6 **STARTS:** The referee must permit the coach or teammate of a hearing impaired swimmer to give an appropriate hand signal simultaneously with the firing of the gun. The coach or teammate may stand on the starting blocks or at any vantage point to be determined by the referee.

7.030 ATHLETIC UNIFORMS

Commercial advertising, with the exception of the manufacturer's logo as permitted by NFHS Rule, is prohibited on all athletic uniforms.

7.040 ORDER OF EVENTS

The order of events for all interscholastic swimming & diving meets shall be as follows:

- (1) 200-yard medley relay
- (2) 200-yard freestyle
- (3) 200-yard individual medley
- (4) 50-yard freestyle
- (5) One-meter Diving
- (6) 100-yard butterfly
- (7) 100-yard freestyle
- (8) 500-yard freestyle
- (9) 200-yard freestyle relay
- (10) 100-yard backstroke
- (11) 100-yard breaststroke
- (12) 400-yard freestyle relay

7.050 DIVING COMPETITION

There shall be no minimum total degree of difficulty for optional dives. The degree of difficulty for all dives is listed in the National Federation Swimming & Diving Rules Book.

7.060 PROTESTS

7.061 Protests of interscholastic contests shall not be allowed. The decision of the officials, including those of the Jury of Appeals, shall be final.

7.062 The outcome (i.e. winners and losers) of all interscholastic contests are final, and cannot be reversed, except where the rules of the sport permit or in the case where a winner must forfeit its victory or points.

8.000 – Unsportsmanlike Conduct

8.010 SPORTSMANSHIP

8.011 Student-athletes, coaches, administrators, spectators and all other persons connected directly or indirectly with a member school, as well as contest officials, shall adhere to the principles of good sportsmanship and the ethics of competition before, during and after all contests in which they participate and/or attend.

8.020 DISQUALIFICATION OF A STUDENT-ATHLETE

8.021 A student-athlete who is disqualified (ejected) from a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct or a flagrant foul shall be ineligible to compete for the remainder of that contest and in any interscholastic athletic contest for the next seven (7) calendar day at the same level, or any level, of participation in which the student-athlete was disqualified (ejected). If less than two (2) contests are scheduled during this seven-day period of time

at the same level as disqualification (ejection), the student shall be ineligible for the next football game or a minimum of the next two (2) contests in all other sports. If the disqualification (ejection) occurs in the last contest of a season, the student shall be ineligible for the same period of time as stated above in the next sport in which the student participates.

8.022 A student-athlete who is disqualified (ejected) from a contest for any act of gross unsportsmanlike conduct, or a second or subsequent act of general unsportsmanlike conduct or flagrant foul, shall be ineligible to compete in any interscholastic athletic contest for a period of up to six weeks. Acts constituting gross unsportsmanlike conduct are defined in FHSAA Bylaw 11.11.2.

8.023 It is the responsibility of the local school authorities to ensure this policy is enforced. When an ineligible student is allowed to participate, forfeiture of the contest is mandatory. This policy applies to all regular season and State Series competition.

8.024 In the event that more than three (3) students from the same school are disqualified (ejected) for any form of unsportsmanlike conduct in any one sport within the same school year, that school shall be assessed a minimum financial penalty of \$100 per disqualification (ejection) for the remainder of the school year beginning with the fourth disqualification (ejection) and shall have its program in that sport placed on administrative probation for one or more years in addition to monetary penalties and student suspensions.

8.025 When the first disqualification (ejection) of a student for “gross unsportsmanlike conduct” as defined in FHSAA Bylaw 11.11.2 occurs, a written warning shall be issued to the school represented by the offending student that each subsequent disqualification (ejection) of a student for an act of “gross unsportsmanlike conduct” in any sport will subject the school to a minimum financial penalty of \$250 per occurrence. Beginning with the next disqualification (ejection) of a student for an act of “gross unsportsmanlike conduct” in any sport the minimum financial penalty of \$250 shall be assessed.

8.026 Meet hosts and/or officials must report acts of unsportsmanlike conduct by student-athletes to the FHSAA Office using the “Unsportsmanlike Conduct Incident Report” (Form AT5).

8.030 DISQUALIFICATION OF A COACH

8.031 A coach who is disqualified (ejected) from a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct shall be suspended from coaching for the remainder of that contest and in any interscholastic athletic contest for the next seven (7) calendar day at the same level, or any level, of participation in which the coach was disqualified (ejected). If less than two (2) contests are scheduled during this seven-day period of time at the same level as the disqualification (ejection), the coach shall be suspended for the next football game or a minimum of the next two (2) contests in all other sports. If the disqualification (ejection) occurs in the last contest of a season, the coach shall be ineligible for the same period of time as stated above in the next sport in which he/she coaches.

8.032 A coach who is disqualified (ejected) from a contest for any act of gross unsportsmanlike conduct, or a second or subsequent act of general unsportsmanlike conduct, shall be ineligible to coach in any interscholastic athletic contest for a period of up to six weeks. Acts constituting gross unsportsmanlike conduct are defined in FHSAA Bylaw 11.11.2.

8.033 When disqualified (ejection) from a contest, a coach shall immediately leave the premises or facility (i.e. gymnasium in basketball, volleyball and wrestling; stadium in baseball, football, soccer and softball, etc.) to a place where the coach is not visible to either student-athletes, officials, spectators or other coaches; and to where the contest itself is not visible to the coach. A disqualified (ejected) coach shall not have any further contact with or give instruction to athletes or other members of the coaching staff for the

remainder of the contest, including halftime intermission; breaks between quarters, periods or innings; and post-contest activities.

8.034 A coach who has drawn a suspension from the next contest or number of contests after having been disqualified (ejected) from the previous contest shall not attend the contest from which he/she has been suspended in any capacity and shall not be present at the site. A suspended coach also shall be prohibited from accompanying his/her team to the site of the contest.

8.035 A school whose coach is disqualified (ejected) from a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct shall be assessed a monetary penalty of not less than \$100. Additional minimum fines may be imposed for unsportsmanlike conduct by the coach as stipulated in the Penalty Code of the FHSAA Handbook as follows:

- Use of profanity or other such gutter language by a coach – \$150.00
- Coach continuing to give instruction to his/her student-athletes or other members of the coaching staff after having been disqualified from a contest – \$150.00
- Pursuit of officials with intent following a contest by a coach or other school personnel – \$150.00
- Refusal of a disqualified coach to leave the court, playing field or team area – \$100.00
- Physical contact by a coach or other school personnel with an official – \$250.00
- Removal by a coach or other school personnel of a team or individual from an athletic contest prior to its normal conclusion – \$250.00

8.036 When a coach is disqualified (ejected) from a contest and no other authorized school personnel are to take charge of the student-athletes, the contest shall be forfeited.

8.037 It is the responsibility of the local school authorities to ensure this policy is enforced. When a coach is allowed to coach in a contest from which he/she has been suspended, the school shall face additional penalties. This policy applies to all regular season and State Series competition.

8.038 Meet hosts and/or officials must report acts of unsportsmanlike conduct by coaches to the FHSAA Office using the “Unsportsmanlike Conduct Incident Report” (Form AT5).

8.040 PUBLIC CRITICISM OF OFFICIALS

No coach or other school employee shall publicly criticize or berate an official prior to, during or following a contest. Professional ethics require that coaches and other school employees use proper channels to report their complaints about officials rather than airing them publicly. A minimum fine of \$50 shall be assessed the school whose coach or other employees are in violation of this provision.

9.000 – Use of Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Substances

9.001 The use of alcohol, tobacco or tobacco-like products by student-athletes, coaches and officials is prohibited during any interscholastic athletic contest and in the vicinity of the competition. A student-athlete in violation of this policy is guilty of gross unsportsmanlike conduct, shall be disqualified from the contest and shall be suspended from subsequent contests in accordance with the provisions of 8.022. The official must report any violation of this policy by either a student-athlete or coach to the FHSAA Office. Violation of this policy by a student-athlete or coach shall subject the school to a monetary penalty. Violation of this policy by an official shall subject the official to a monetary penalty or suspension or both. For violations of this policy, a minimum fine of \$100.00 shall be assessed.

9.002 The use of anabolic steroids or other performance-enhancing drugs by a student-athlete is not permissible and is considered to be an act of gross unsportsmanlike conduct.

A student-athlete discovered to be using such substances shall be ineligible to compete in any interscholastic contest until such time as medical evidence can be presented that the student's system is free of those substances.

10.000 – Crowd Control

The home school administration is responsible for the control of spectators during a contest. The FHSAA recommends that the home school administration secure uniformed security to assist with this responsibility. However, the officials assigned to work a contest are responsible for the conduct of the contest itself. In the event a spectator or spectators interfere with the conduct of a contest or cause an official to become distracted through continual, unrelenting verbal abuse, the official should immediately stop the action and report the spectator or spectators to the home school administration or the nearest uniformed security officer and ask that they be restrained or removed from the facility. If the home school administration or uniformed security is unwilling or unable to comply and the official does not believe the contest can be safely continued, the official must declare the contest ended at that point. Under no circumstance should an official ever confront, challenge, rebuke or threaten a spectator, or make gestures of any kind toward a spectator before, during or after a contest.

11.000 – Inclement Weather and Suspended Contest Procedures

11.001 If a severe thunderstorm or electrical storm occurs in the area prior to the start of or during any outdoor contest, the officials must immediately contact the principal of each school involved in the contest to determine if the contest should be played as scheduled, delayed, suspended or postponed. If the principal of either of the schools involved requests that the contest be interrupted or postponed, the officials must immediately honor such request. If the principal of only one of the competing schools is available, his/her request must be honored.

11.002 The safety and welfare of all concerned is of paramount importance. In no case may an official deny a request by a principal to delay, suspend or postpone an outdoor contest due to inclement weather or imply that the contest will be forfeited as a result of such a request.

11.003 A suspended contest shall be resumed from the point of interruption. Otherwise, National Federation Rules regarding the resumption of suspended contests will apply.

11.004 If severe weather occurs in the area prior to the start of, or during any, scheduled outdoor game, tournament or meet and the event is delayed, postponed, suspended or cancelled, special rules apply. If for other unforeseen reasons, a game, tournament or meet is delayed, postponed, suspended or cancelled, special rules apply.

11.005 If tickets have been sold for the event and any revenue related to the event is retained by the school, then the regular financial reporting process must be completed with payments to the FHSAA and to the participating school(s). If free entry is given for a future event, the revenue received and retained should be reported for the event. If money is refunded and not retained then it should not be included as revenue reported for the event. If tickets were presold for the event and the event was cancelled before it was to begin, then the revenue received and retained (not refunded) from the presold tickets should be reported on the financial report.

11.006 If a financial hardship results from the inclement weather and the related loss of playing time, the host school should submit a written request for waiver of financial share payments. Requests should be submitted to the Associate Commissioner for Athletic

Operations. Requests will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

12.000 – Filming, Videotaping Contests

12.001 A visiting school may film or videotape its team's or contestants' performance in a contest when permission is secured from and arrangements are made with the host school principal. Videographers and their equipment must be positioned so that they do not block the view of any spectator.

12.002 No representative of a school that is not participating in a contest may film or videotape all or any part of the contest unless permission to do so is granted by the principal of each school which is participating in the contest.

12.003 Any school violating these guidelines is guilty of unsportsmanlike conduct and shall be subject to reprimand and the assessment of a financial penalty by the FHSAA.

13.000 – Officials

13.001 FHSAA regulations do not provide for the registration of swimming & diving officials. The meet director of each meet shall be responsible for securing the necessary officials as required by NFHS Rules for the meet that his/her school is hosting.

13.002 Protests shall not be allowed. The decisions of the meet officials shall be final.

2002 FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series

In accordance with Article 9.8.0 of the FHSAA Bylaws, the following regulations governing the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series have been approved by the FHSAA Board of Directors:

14.000 – Participation

14.010 SCHOOLS

14.011 Participation in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series is voluntary and limited only to those schools that include grades 10 through 12 or any combination thereof and are full members of the Association. Compensation for expenses of schools competing in the FHSAA State Series is not guaranteed.

14.012 A school shall enter only one (1) team in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series.

14.013 A high school that joins the Association shall not be eligible to enter a team or individual into the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series in its initial year of membership. Neither shall a continuing member school that is starting a swimming & diving program for the first time or resuming a cross country program that was previously discontinued be eligible to enter a team into the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series until the school has fielded a varsity team and participated in a representative schedule against other member schools for a minimum of one school year. A representative schedule is defined as being eight (8) or more of the maximum number of contests (15) allowed. These provisions shall not apply to newly opening public high schools that join the Association in their initial two years of existence.

14.014 A team shall compete in a minimum of eight (8) regular season meets to be eligible to participate in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series.

14.020 STUDENT-ATHLETES

14.021 Only student-athletes eligible under Bylaw 11 and applicable administrative guidelines, regulations, policies and procedures may compete in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series. In accordance with Bylaws 11.12.1 and 11.13.1, member schools are required to certify the eligibility of their student-athletes prior to the beginning of competition and to withhold ineligible student-athletes from all interscholastic competition.

14.022 To be eligible to participate in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series a student-athlete shall participate in a minimum of four (4) varsity or junior varsity swimming & diving meets during the regular season.

14.023 Only those student-athletes who were enrolled in and in regular attendance at a school prior to Saturday, Oct. 26, shall be eligible to represent that school in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series during the 2002-03 school year. Student-athletes who transfer to and enroll in a school after that date shall not be eligible to represent that school in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series for the 2002-03 school year.

14.024 Girls only may participate in the girls division of the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series. Boys only may participate in the boys division of the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series.

15.000 – Commitment to Participate

15.001 Each member school that elected to participate in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series for the 2001-02 and 2002-03 school years was required to notify the FHSAA Office of its intent to do so on the appropriate FHSAA State Series Commitment Form during the 2000-01 school year.

15.002 A properly executed commitment form is a binding agreement between the member school and the Association. The following penalties shall be assessed a member school that commits to participate in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series and then subsequently withdraws from, or fails to honor, its commitment:

(a) If the school withdraws from its commitment after submitting the form to the FHSAA Office but before the classification and district assignments are released, the school shall be assessed a \$50.00 administrative fee.

(b) If the school withdraws from its commitment after the classification and district assignments are released, but before the District Meet Planning Meeting, the school shall be assessed a \$100.00 administrative fee and its swimming & diving program may be placed on administrative probation.

(c) If the school withdraws from its commitment after the District Meet Planning Meeting, the school shall be assessed a \$250.00 administrative fee, and its swimming & diving will be placed on restrictive probation and will not be allowed to participate in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series for the two-year period for which the commitment form originally was filed, as well as the next two-year period, unless the reason stated for such failure to participate is ruled sufficient by the Commissioner or the Board of Directors.

15.003 A school that does not commit to participate in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series by the commitment deadline, and later submits a request to participate to the FHSAA Office shall:

(a) Be assessed an administrative fee of \$50 if the request is received before the classification and district assignments are released.

(b) Be assessed an administrative fee of \$100 if the request is received after the classification and district assignments are released, but before the first permissible regular season competition date.

(c) Be assessed an administrative fee of \$250 if the request is received after the first permissible regular season competition date, but before the District Meet Planning Meeting.

No school, under any circumstance, shall be assigned to a classification and district in the FHSAA State Series if its request for such assignment is received in the FHSAA Office on or after the date of the District Meet Planning Meeting.

15.004 By committing to participate in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series, a member school agrees to participate in accordance with and abide by all the guidelines, regulations, policies and procedures for the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series.

16.000 – Official Entry List

16.001 Each school participating in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series shall submit by facsimile (fax) transmission to the Director of the District Meet to which it is assigned not later than 5 p.m. Monday, Nov. 4, the “2002 FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series Official Entry List” (Forms SW1 & SW2) containing the names of those student-athletes who will represent the school in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series. To be valid, the Official Entry List must bear the signatures of the principal, FHSAA Representative or Athletic Director and Head Girls and/or Boys Swimming & Diving Coach. An Official Entry List not bearing each of these signatures is not to be

accepted. An Official Entry List cannot be e-mailed.

16.002 There is no limit on the number of student-athletes that a school may include on its Official Entry List.

16.003 A late filing fee of \$50.00 will be assessed a school whose Official Entry List is not received by the District Meet Director by the 5 p.m. Monday, Nov. 4, deadline. The late filing fee will increase to \$100.00 if the Official Entry List is not received by the District Meet Director by 5 p.m. Friday, Nov. 8. A school whose Official Entry List is not received by the time designated for the meeting to determine the seeding and lane assignments of competitors in the District Meet may be permitted to participate in competition only with the approval of the FHSAA Office; however, that school will be assessed a minimum financial penalty of \$250. This penalty will increase if it is later determined that any student-athlete(s) representing the school in uniform were ineligible to do so. Under no circumstances shall the District Meet Director permit a school for which he/she has no Official Entry List to participate in the District Meet without the approval of the FHSAA Office.

16.004 The Official Entry List may contain only the names of those student-athletes previously reported to the FHSAA Office on an Annual Eligibility List (Form EL1) or on line via iFHSAA (the Association's new interactive online database). All student-athletes must be eligible before they participate.

16.005 Once a school submits its Official Entry List to the District Meet Director, it may make additions or changes to that list only by faxing the "2002-03 FHSAA State Series Request for Addition or Change to Official Entry List" (Form AT7) directly to the attention of Dorothy W. Brunson, Director of Member Services, in the FHSAA Office at (352) 373-1528. The request must include a copy of the original Official Entry List that was submitted to the District Meet Director. Once approved, the FHSAA Office will fax the additions or changes to the District Meet Director. No fee will be assessed for requests for additions or changes received in the FHSAA Office prior to the 5 p.m. Monday, Nov. 4, submission deadline. Requests for additions or changes received after the submission deadline, however, will result in the assessment of an administrative fee of \$50.00 per addition or change. The administrative fee for the late addition(s) will appear on the school's next monthly statement. Requests for additions or changes are permissible until the time designated for the meeting to determine the seeding and lane assignments of competitors in the District Meet. Once the seeding meeting begins, no additions or changes may be made, except that a school that qualifies relay teams to the Florida Finals state championship meet may make additions for relay teams for the State Meet. A student-athlete whose name was not originally submitted on the Official Entry List is not eligible to participate in the District Meet until the addition of his/her name is approved by the FHSAA Office.

16.006 The District Meet Director shall forward to the FHSAA Office the Official Entry Lists for all schools participating in the District Meet within 10 business days of the conclusion of the District Meet.

17.000 – Classifications

17.010 ENROLLMENTS OF SCHOOLS

17.011 The classification of each school committing to participate in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series during the 2001-02 and 2002-03 school years shall be determined on the basis of the school's enrollment in the 9th, 10th and 11th grades combined as reported to the FHSAA in October 2000. Enrollments for schools that enroll girls only or boys only shall be doubled for classification purposes.

17.020 NUMBER OF CLASSIFICATIONS

17.021 The number of classifications in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series for the 2001-02 and 2002-03 school years shall be determined by the number of member schools entering teams in the 2000 FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series. If 85 percent or more of the member senior high schools entered a full team, there may be six classifications; if 70 percent or more entered a full team, there may be five classifications; if 55 percent or more entered a full team, there may be four classifications; if 40 percent or more entered a full team, there may be three classifications; if 25 percent or more entered a full team, there may be two classifications; and if less than 25 percent entered a full team, there may be only one classification. The number of classifications may be changed only during a reclassification year.

17.022 The FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series in the 2001-02 and 2002-03 school years shall be conducted in three school classifications. The three classifications are 3A, 2A and A.

17.030 DIVISION OF CLASSIFICATIONS

17.031 The total number of schools that commit to participate in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series shall be ranked in order of enrollment and evenly divided across the three classifications. Any remainder shall be evenly distributed among the classifications beginning with the lowest classification and working up. The enrollment of the smallest school in the classifications shall form the dividing lines between the classifications. Schools that have the same enrollment as a school whose enrollment forms the dividing lines between classifications shall be placed with that school into the higher classification. The requisite number of schools shall then be assigned to the succeeding classifications. Once the dividing lines between classifications are determined for a classification period, they shall not be changed prior to or during that classification period.

17.032 The dividing lines between the classifications for the 2001-02 and 2002-03 school years are as follows:

- Schools with enrollments of 1,712 students and above inclusive shall be Class 3A;
- Schools with enrollments of 1,130 to 1,711 students inclusive shall be Class 2A; and
- Schools with enrollments of 1 to 1,129 students inclusive shall be Class A.

17.033 A new member school that requests to participate in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series at the time of joining, shall be assigned to the appropriate classification according to its enrollment.

18.000 – Districts

18.010 ASSIGNMENT

Schools that committed to participate in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series shall be assigned on a geographical basis to one of 10 districts in their respective classifications (see Appendix D). A meet shall be conducted in each district following the conclusion of the regular season on the dates specified herein to determine the individual competitors who shall represent that district in the FHSAA Florida Swimming & Diving Finals.

18.020 REGULAR SEASON COMPETITION

Competition between schools assigned to a district is not required during the regular season in swimming & diving.

18.030 PLANNING MEETINGS

18.031 Each district must conduct a District Meet Planning Meeting on Monday, Sept. 9. The meeting must be held at a time so that all schools in the district can have a representa-

tive present with no loss of time from school. Exceptions to this policy must be made in writing to the Commissioner. The meeting must be conducted by the FHSAA representative from the school identified as District Leader in the district assignments (see Appendix D). The District Leader is responsible for all aspects of the District Meet until the date of the meet at which time the Meet Director shall assume responsibility for the event.

18.032 The District Leader must notify in writing the FHSAA representative, athletic director, girls swimming & diving coach and boys swimming & diving coach of each school in his/her district of the site and time of the District Meet Planning Meeting at least seven (7) days prior to the date of the meeting. If, however, the FHSAA representative, athletic director, girls swimming & diving coach or boys swimming & diving coach at a given school has not received written notification from the district leader relative to the site and time of the District Meet Planning Meeting, it is their responsibility to contact the district leader for the arrangements.

18.033 Each school in a district is required to have one voting representative present at the District Meet Planning Meeting. All decisions will be made by a majority vote of those representatives present. There can be no voting by proxy. A school which fails to have a representative present at this meeting will be assessed a financial penalty of \$50.00.

18.034 AGENDA: The following items of business must be addressed at the District Meet Planning Meeting:

1. Review FHSAA rules, policies, terms and conditions governing the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series, including the FHSAA Licensing and Merchandising Policy.
2. Select host school, site and determine time schedule. (Note: An actual host school must be selected at this meeting and may be subsequently changed only with the permission of the Commissioner.)
3. Determine particulars for securing Hy-Tek Meet Manager software and the necessary hardware to be used to transmit the results of the District Meet to the FHSAA Office and State Meet Director.
4. Determine team awards to be ordered.
5. Determine number of passes to be allowed competing teams.
6. Determine financial arrangements. See Item 22.031(a)(b) and (c) under financial terms.
7. Determine the amount of compensation, not to exceed \$50.00, to be paid to the Meet Director.
8. Other items as should be addressed during this meeting.

18.035 The FHSAA Office will mail each District Leader a form on which to record the decisions made during the District Meet Planning Meeting. The report form should be completed and returned to the FHSAA Office immediately after the meeting is concluded. A copy of the report form as well as the minutes of the meeting should be mailed to each school in the district.

19.000 – State Series Structure

19.010 LEVELS

The FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series shall be conducted as a series of successive meets designated respectively: District and Florida Finals.

19.020 DISTRICT MEETS

19.021 Dates and Time Schedules: District Meets shall be held during Week 19 (Nov. 11-16, 2002) on a date and time schedule to be determined by district members during the District Meet Planning Meeting. No District Meet, however, shall begin competition earlier than 9 a.m. local time.

19.022 Sites: The site for each District Meet shall be determined by district members during the District Meet Planning Meeting.

19.023 Team Entries: Each school shall be limited to maximum of four entries per individual event and a maximum of one entry per relay event.

19.024 Individual Entries: A contestant shall be limited to four events, no more than two of which shall be individual events. Participation in a preliminary heat for an event counts as participation in that event.

19.025 Seeding Meeting: A district may hold a seeding meeting, separate from the coaches meeting, to place entrants into the various events for the District Meet according to the following guidelines:

(a) When a seeding meeting is scheduled, it must be designated as a seeding meeting and not as a coaches meeting. The time of the meeting and the deadline for submitting entries must be issued in writing to each school in the district.

(b) When a district elects to hold its seeding meeting immediately preceding the start of the District Meet, each school must be notified in writing that entries for all events will take place at that time and that meeting will serve as the deadline for submitting entrants into an event.

(c) Each school must be represented at the seeding meeting if its students are to be seeded, unless attendance at the meeting is prevented by some unavoidable situation. The problem as to whether the absence was due to an unavoidable situation will be subject to solution by the Meet Director, if possible. If the Meet Director cannot arrive at a satisfactory solution, the matter will be referred to the FHSAA Office.

19.026 Meet Management Software: Each District Meet shall use Hy-Tek Meet Manager software to transmit results to the FHSAA Office. The school names and abbreviations developed by the FHSAA Office, which are provided in Appendix E, shall be used when entering competitors into the computer.

19.027 Coaches Meeting: A pre-meet coaches meeting shall be held prior to the start of each District Meet to cover items of information or rulings that are necessary for the administration of the meet. This meeting is not a seeding meeting, and no entries shall be accepted at this time. Contestants may be withdrawn (scratched) from the meet by their coaches at this time by notifying the Meet Director. Contestants scratched at this time shall be disqualified from participating in the meet. Coaches must make every effort to review the listing of contestants in each event to ensure that each of their contestants is properly entered and that each name is correct.

19.030 FLORIDA FINALS

19.031 Date and Site: The Florida Finals in each classification shall be held on Thursday, Friday and Saturday of Week 20 (Nov. 21-23, 2002) at the International Swimming Hall of Fame complex in Fort Lauderdale. The state championship meet in each respective classification shall be held on the following days:

20.000 – Advancement of Winners

20.010 DISTRICT TO FLORIDA FINALS

20.011 Swimming Events: Forty (40) contestants shall advance from District Meets to the Florida Finals in each event in swimming competition as follows: the first three (3) places in each swimming event from each District Meet as well as the next ten (10) overall best times at large from places four, five and six in all District Meets.

- (a) In the event of a tie for the last (third) qualifying place in any swimming event in a District Meet, a swim-off shall be held to break the tie.
- (b) In the event of a tie for the last (tenth) at-large qualifying place to the Florida Finals, all of the competitors tied shall be allowed to advance to the Florida Finals.

20.012 Diving Competition: Forty (40) contestants may advance from District Meets to the Florida Finals in diving competition as follows: the first four (4) places in diving competition from each District Meet, provided the diver has a minimum qualifying score of 280.0 points in district competition.

- (a) Any remaining available spaces shall be filled on an at-large basis from all competing divers who placed fifth or sixth in their respective District Meets and met the minimum qualifying score of 280.0 points.
- (b) In the event of a tie for the last (40th) at-large qualifying place to the Florida Finals, all of the competitors tied shall be allowed to advance to the Florida Finals.

20.013 Qualifying times for at-large entries into the Florida Finals will be posted on the FHSAA web site at www.fhsaa.org.

20.014 Contestants, whether individuals or members of relay teams, must participate in the finals of the District Meet to qualify for the Florida Finals. Performances during preliminary competition, including record performances, do not automatically earn the contestant a place in the Florida Finals.

20.015 Relay teams qualify from the District Meet to the Florida Finals as a team, not

as individuals. Any eligible swimmer whose name appears on an Official Entry List may swim on a relay team provided the swimmer's name also is entered on a relay card.

20.020 PRELIMS TO FINALS

20.021 District Meet: Swimmers shall qualify from the preliminaries to the championship finals and consolation finals on the basis of time.

20.022 Florida Finals: Swimmers shall qualify from the preliminaries to the championship finals and consolation finals on the basis of time. The eight fastest swimmers in preliminary competition shall advance to the championship finals. The next eight fastest swimmers in preliminary competition shall advance to the consolation finals. In case of a tie for the last qualifying place to either the championship finals or consolation finals, a swim-off shall be held.

20.030 FAILURE TO COMPETE

20.031 District Meet: A contestant who is entered and does not show up/scratches at the time of the preliminary event or does not show up/scratches for a final event shall be disqualified for the remainder of the meet. Scratches are not allowed in District Meets or the Florida Finals. Once the competitor's name has been entered for the event, he/she is charged with that event. A relay team that does not show up/scratch the event shall be disqualified for the remainder of the meet. Individuals or relay teams missing an event because of lateness shall not be excused and shall be disqualified for the remainder of the meet. The use of alternates is strictly prohibited.

20.032 Florida Finals: If an individual qualifies for the Florida Finals and does not show up for an event or scratches from an event, he/she shall be disqualified for the remainder of the meet. A relay team shall be disqualified under the same provision. The use of alternates is strictly prohibited. Failure to participate in the Florida Finals by an individual or relay team is a violation of FHSAA Policy and shall subject the school to a \$50 penalty unless the reason for failure to participate is approved by the FHSAA Office.

20.033 A student-athlete who qualifies in an FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series meet is expected to compete on successive levels of the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series unless ill, injured, suspended due to disciplinary action, or for any other reason acceptable to the Commissioner.

20.040 FORFEITURES AND VACATIONS OF BRACKETS, STANDINGS

20.041 Individuals or teams that are eliminated from FHSAA State Series competition by defeat by individuals or teams that later are ordered to forfeit their victory, place and/or points, or are vacated from a bracket or standings, are not reinstated and do not advance in the FHSAA State Series competition from which they were eliminated by defeat.

20.042 If championships or other placements in FHSAA State Series competitions are ordered vacated by individuals or teams, other individuals or teams neither advance to those placements nor receive awards for those placements.

21.000 – Local Management

21.010 DESIGNATION OF LOCAL DIRECTOR

The FHSAA representative of the host school shall be the Local Director for the meet in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series that his/her school is hosting. He/she will be responsible for making the necessary preparations to host the meet and for the filing of necessary reports to the FHSAA Office upon conclusion of the meet as per FHSAA policy.

21.020 REPORTING RESULTS

The Local Director of each District Meet must submit to both the FHSAA Office and the Director of the Florida Finals the results of the District Meet that his/her school hosted. These results must be transmitted using Hy-Tek Meet Manager . The first and last names of each qualifier must be provided. These results must be submitted immediately upon conclusion of the meet.

22.000 – Financial Terms

22.010 ADMISSION PRICES

22.011 The Board of Directors has established the following admission prices for the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series:

- District Meets – \$4.00 per session
- Florida Finals – \$7.00 per session

22.012 The admission price as stated in 20.011 shall be charged by the host school for the meet(s) in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series for which it serves as host unless waived in writing by the Associate Commissioner for Athletic Operations **in advance** of the meet.

22.020 TICKETS

22.021 Required: Numbered tickets shall be sold, must be torn in half by ticket takers so that they cannot be resold, and must be accounted for in the ticket sales section of the financial report form that is to be completed and submitted to the FHSAA Office.

22.022 District Meets: The host school must furnish the tickets to be sold for admission to the District Meet which it hosts.

22.023 Florida Finals: The host school/organization must furnish the tickets to be sold for admission to the Florida Finals.

22.030 DIVISION OF RECEIPTS

22.031 District Meets: (a) Each District Meet shall be financially independent. The gross gate receipts of each District Meet shall be divided as follows:

- 85 percent to the host school
- 15 percent to the FHSAA

All expenses shall be paid from the host school's share of the gross gate receipts. If, however, a District Meet shows a net profit of \$250 or less, the host school shall retain the net profit and no percentage shall be paid to the FHSAA.

(b) The net profit is determined by subtracting total expenditures from the total revenue on the financial report form. Total revenue includes income from all ticket sales and any Broadcast Rights Fees paid by radio and/or television stations that are approved by the FHSAA Office to broadcast the meet.

(c) If a District Meet shows a net loss on the financial report form, the FHSAA shall compensate the host school up to \$250 for the loss, subject to the following provisions:

1. The host school must charge the full admission price established in 22.011;
2. The host school must sell numbered tickets and account for all tickets sold in the ticket manifest section of the financial report form, as stipulated in 22.021;
3. The host school must file a financial report form for the meet within 21 calendar days of the completion of the meet as stipulated in 22.031(f);
4. The host school must submit with the financial report form the FHSAA State Series Contest Pass Gate Sign-In Form(s) as stipulated in 23.030; and
5. The host school must be in compliance with all policies for the event.

(d) By unanimous vote of those representatives present at the District Meet Planning

Meeting the terms of Item 20.031(a)(b) and (c) may be set aside and the net profit, less the 15 percent share due the FHSAA, or net loss greater than \$250 incurred by a District Meet, pro-rated among participating schools. If the vote is not unanimous, the terms of Item 22.031(a)(b) and (c) must be followed.

(e) Each school participating in a District Meet shall be responsible to pay any and all expenses related to its team. Neither the FHSAA nor the host school will assume responsibility for any participating school expenses of any kind.

(f) The appropriate “FHSAA State Series Financial Report Form” (Form FN3) must be submitted to the FHSAA Office as well as to all participating schools within 21 calendar days of the completion of the District Meet by the host school. Payment of profit shares due the FHSAA must be included with the report. Failure to file a financial report within the 21-day period, will result in the forfeiture of any reimbursement to which the host school is entitled. If this report is not received in the FHSAA Office within 30 calendar days, a late filing fee of \$25 will be assessed. See Appendix C for “Guidelines on Filing of Financial Reports and Payment of Revenue Shares.”

22.032 Florida Finals: Terms and conditions for the payment of expenses and the division of net profits relative to the Florida Finals will be established in the provisions of the contract between the FHSAA Office and the host organization. No reimbursement of any kind will be paid to schools which qualify teams and/or individuals to the Florida Finals. Neither the FHSAA nor the host school will assume responsibility for any participating school or contestant expenses of any kind.

23.000 – State Series Rules and Policies

23.010 ADHERENCE TO, ENFORCEMENT OF RULES, POLICIES

23.011 Participating schools shall adhere to all regulations and policies governing the FHSAA State Cross Country Series.

23.012 The determination of the host school for each meet shall be conditioned in part on the school’s willingness to comply with and enforce regulations and policies governing the game. This includes financial terms, as well as licensing and merchandising policies. A school that does not comply with and enforce such regulations and policies shall forfeit its opportunity to serve as host.

23.013 It is the responsibility of the host school to ensure that an atmosphere of neutrality is maintained in all meets held as part of the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series. Such meets are not “home meets” for the host schools. Special festivities held as part of, or in conjunction with, regular season home meets are not permitted during the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series.

23.020 PARTICIPANT PASSES

23.021 At the Florida Finals, a participant pass will be issued to each athlete who qualifies to the Florida Finals. In addition, for those schools that have qualifiers for the Florida Finals, coaches will be issued passes separately for girls and boys competition as follows:

- One to three participants – one head coach
- Four or more participants – one head coach and one assistant coach

In addition, schools that qualify diving competitors will be provided one additional pass for a diving coach.

23.022 No managers will receive participant passes.

23.023 Participant and coach passes will not be transferable and will entitle those persons who receive such passes only to the seating assignment in the participant seating area.

23.024 Each school that qualifies individuals to the Florida Finals must complete and

fax to the State Meet Director Form SW3 containing the names of relay team members who did not qualify as individuals and coaches who are entitled to participant passes in accordance with these terms.

23.030 PASSES

FHSAA State Series Passes, FHSAA Lifetime Passes, FHSAA Student SID Identification Cards and legitimate news media identification cards ONLY shall be honored at all District Meets and the Florida Finals. All individuals who gain admittance to a State Series event using a pass must record their name, signature and type of pass used on the “FHSAA State Series Contest Pass Gate Sign-In Log” (Form AT9). This pass log must be submitted to the FHSAA Office with the financial report.

23.040 ORDER OF EVENTS

23.041 The order of events as listed in the NFHS Swimming & Diving Rules Book as well as Item 7.040 of these regulations shall be followed in all District Meets and the Florida Finals.

23.042 Girls events will precede the corresponding boys events in all District Meets and the Florida Finals, with the exception of diving competitions at the Florida Finals which shall be rotated annually.

23.043 The Meet Referee at a District Meet or the Florida Finals may permit a 15-minute intermission between the finals of the 50-yard freestyle and the 100-yard butterfly at his/her discretion.

23.050 SCORING

District Meets and the Florida Finals shall be scored in accordance with Rule 7 of the NFHS Swimming & Diving Rules Book. Sixteen (16) places shall be scored.

23.060 MEET COMMITTEE

A Meet Committee will be appointed by the Meet Director in accordance with NFHS Rule 4-1-1 at each District Meet and the Florida Finals. The Meet Committee will consist of five coaches and/or athletic directors from five different participating schools. This committee will serve as a jury of appeals. When acting as a jury of appeals, a member of this committee whose team or individual contestant is a party to an appeal must recuse himself/herself and be replaced until the appeal is concluded. The request for an appeal shall be directed to the Meet Committee through the Meet Director. The decision of the Meet Committee shall be final. The Meet Committee may not set aside any rule.

23.070 TIMING DEVICES

23.071 District Meets: Electronic timing devices must be used in District Meets.

23.072 Florida Finals: The use of an electronic timing device at the Florida Finals is mandatory.

23.080 SOUVENIR PROGRAMS

23.081 District Meets: The host school of a District Meet that produces an official souvenir program must display on the program cover the FHSAA Swimming & Diving logo and the “Sport the ‘Tude!” sportsmanship logo, which may be downloaded from the FHSAA web site (www.fhsaa.org). If the program cover is preprinted, the logo must be displayed prominently inside or on the team roster inserts.

23.082 Florida Finals: The FHSAA Office will produce the official souvenir program for the Florida Finals and will retain all proceeds from its sale.

23.090 LICENSING AND MERCHANDISING

23.091 The FHSAA owns or controls all rights and interests in its name, logos, trademarks and service marks, whether registered or unregistered, including the “FHSAA Swimming & Diving” logo and the official event logo for the “2002 FHSAA Florida Swimming & Diving Finals.” The sale of items bearing any of these marks by a member school or organization without the written consent of the FHSAA is prohibited.

23.092 The FHSAA retains the exclusive right to produce and sell souvenir products (apparel and otherwise) at all games, tournaments and meets held as part of the FHSAA State Series; host schools/organizations are required to sell items provided by the official FHSAA event souvenir merchandiser.

23.093 The official FHSAA event souvenir merchandiser is Team IP Sportswear, Inc., of Port St. Lucie. They may be reached at (877) 821-8643. Team IP has been awarded exclusive souvenir merchandising rights to all FHSAA State Series events on the district, regional and state levels in all sports. A host school/organization that desires to sell souvenir merchandise at an FHSAA State Series event must purchase such merchandise from Team IP. No other vendor shall be permitted to produce such merchandise. Team IP shall have the right to go on-property and sell souvenir merchandise at the site of any FHSAA State Series event. The host school/organization of an FHSAA State Series event shall grant Team IP access to its property for the event.

23.094 The host school/organization of an FHSAA State Series event may be permitted to sell generic merchandise unrelated to the event (i.e., apparel and other merchandise bearing the host school/organization’s mark), provided such merchandise has been made available for sale on a consistent basis throughout the year and has not been produced specifically for sale at the FHSAA State Series event.

23.100 PROMOTIONAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

Announcements promoting the FHSAA and its interscholastic programs must be read over the public-address system, if available, prior to and during all meets in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series. See Appendix F for the appropriate script.

23.110 UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT

23.111 The provisions of Section 8.000, including suspensions for student-athletes and coaches who are disqualified for unsportsmanlike conduct, shall be strictly enforced during the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series.

23.112 Unethical and unsportsmanlike conduct by competitors, coaches and spectators shall not be tolerated at any meet that is part of the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series. Each participating school shall be held strictly accountable for unsportsmanlike conduct on the part of its competitors, coaches and spectators at the meet site, hotels and elsewhere.

23.113 If contestants or people from any school entered in any meet in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series are found guilty of carelessness or maliciously breaking, damaging or destroying property or equipment belonging to the host school or host organization, such school shall be held responsible for costs incurred in replacing or repairing such property or equipment.

23.114 Meet hosts and/or officials must report acts of unsportsmanlike conduct by student-athletes, coaches and other individuals to the FHSAA Office using the “Unsportsmanlike Conduct Incident Report” (Form AT5)

23.120 UNIFORMED SECURITY

The Meet Director for District Meets and the Florida Finals is responsible for providing

proper uniformed security at the meet that his/her school is hosting.

24.000 – Media Requirements

24.010 CREDENTIALS

24.011 Space must be set aside to provide for news media representatives covering a meet in the FHSAA State Swimming & Diving Series whether they be from newspapers, radio stations, commercial television stations and/or cable television stations.

24.012 News media representatives covering a District Meet must be admitted free of charge to the meet upon presentation of proper news media identification.

24.013 News media representatives planning to cover the Florida Finals must secure credentials as instructed by the FHSAA Office, according to the FHSAA Policy on Media Credentials. Requests for credentials must be submitted to the FHSAA Office not later than 5 p.m. EST Monday of the week of the Florida Finals. Only those representatives requesting credentials by the deadline will be guaranteed seating and informational materials at the tournament.

24.014 Reporting information to the news media and/or the FHSAA Office, as stipulated in instructions to Local Directors, will be the responsibility of the Local Director and is required.

24.020 MEDIA RIGHTS

24.021 Radio broadcasts, telecasts, cablecasts and webcasts of games in the FHSAA State Football Series are governed by the FHSAA Broadcast Policy. Such broadcasts, telecasts, cablecasts and webcasts must be approved by the FHSAA Office.

23.022 Radio, TV and internet outlets must submit the “Application for Media Rights to FHSAA State Series Event” (Form AT10) to the FHSAA Office by 3 p.m. EST on the business day preceding the meet to be broadcast, telecast, or cablecast to avoid a \$25.00 late filing fee.

24.023 Radio broadcast rights fees are \$50.00 per match. Tape-delay telecast and cablecast rights fees are \$250.00 per meet. Rights fees for live telecasts and cablecasts shall be negotiated at the discretion of the FHSAA. Rights fees must be paid by company check made payable to “FHSAA” and mailed directly to the FHSAA Office within 30 days of the match. Outlets that fail to make payment of rights fees by the deadline shall be assessed a \$25.00 late fee and may be denied rights to broadcast, telecast or cablecast future contests.

(a) The FHSAA Radio Network owns exclusive rights to the radio broadcast of all FHSAA Florida Swimming & Diving Finals state championship meets.

(b) Sunshine Network owns exclusive rights to the telecast and cablecast of all FHSAA Florida Swimming & Diving Finals state championship meets.

(c) iHigh Inc. owns exclusive rights to the webcast of all contests in the FHSAA State Series.

24.024 Approval of radio broadcasts, telecasts and cablecasts of FHSAA State Series contests by the FHSAA Office are final. The FHSAA Office shall fax to the host school of an FHSAA State Series contest a copy of the approved broadcast, telecast or cablecast agreement. A school shall not permit the radio broadcast, telecast or cablecast of an FHSAA State Series contest for which it is serving as host that has not been approved by the FHSAA Office.

25.000 – Awards

25.010 TEAM AWARDS

25.011 District Meets: Trophies are available for awarding to the champion and runner-up teams, and may be purchased from the FHSAA's authorized vendor by the host school or district as an expense of the meet as determined by those school representatives present at the District Meet Planning Meeting, or individually by the champion and runner-up schools. There shall be no other team awards presented by outside organizations or individuals.

25.012 Florida Finals: Trophies will be awarded to the champion and runner-up in each class in the Florida Finals. There shall be no other team awards presented by outside organizations or individuals.

25.013 FHSAA Authorized Vendor: Trophies for champion and runner-up teams in District Meets must be ordered from The Trophy Shop in Gainesville by calling (352) 372-8551. The vendor should also be contacted if problems are experienced in receiving trophies on time and in good condition.

25.020 INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

25.021 District Meets: Ribbons to be awarded to the first six placing individuals will be furnished to the host school by the FHSAA Office. There will be no other individual awards presented by outside organizations or individuals.

25.022 Florida Finals: Medallions to be awarded to the first eight placing individuals will be furnished to the host school by the FHSAA Office. Medallions to be awarded members of the champion and runner-up teams will also be provided. There shall be no other individual awards presented by outside organizations or individuals.

26.000 – Officials

26.001 FHSAA regulations do not provide for the registration of swimming & diving officials. The meet director of each District Meet shall be responsible for securing the necessary officials as required by NFHS rules for the meet that his/her school is hosting.

26.002 The Meet Director for the Florida Finals, in consultation with the FHSAA Office, shall be responsible for securing the necessary officials as required by NFHS Rules.

26.003 Protests shall not be allowed. The decisions of the meet officials shall be final.

Appendix A

FHSAA Eligibility Rules-in-Brief

Coaches must understand that these rules-in-brief are general statements only. Complete eligibility rules are contained in Article 11 of the FHSAA Bylaws. See your principal or athletic director if you have questions or need further explanation of details and exceptions.

To be eligible to represent your school in interscholastic athletics, a student-athlete:

1. Must be regularly enrolled and in regular attendance at your school. If the student is a home education student or attend a charter school that is not a member of the FHSAA, the student must declare in writing his/her intention to participate in athletics to the school at which he/she is permitted to participate prior to the first day of practice. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.1)
2. Must enroll in school within 10 days of the beginning of each semester to be eligible during that semester. If not, the student must make up all work missed and be in attendance a minimum of one day for each day missed due to late enrollment before your principal can declare the student eligible. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.1)
3. Must maintain a cumulative 2.0 grade point average on a 4.0 unweighted scale through the end of the previous semester as required by Florida Statutes. This GPA must include all courses taken since the student entered high school. Sixth-graders, seventh-graders and eighth-graders must have been regularly promoted from the previous grade, carry a normal class load, do satisfactory classroom work and maintain a satisfactory conduct record. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.2)
4. Must not have graduated from any high school or its equivalent. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.2)
5. Must participate at the school in which the student first enrolls, or at which the student first takes part in an athletic practice, at the beginning of the school year. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.3)
6. Must transfer from his/her previous school prior to the first day of practice and secure an “Application for Waiver of the Transfer Rule” signed by the principal of both the previous school attended and your school. If the student transfers on or after the first day of practice in a sport the student cannot participate in that sport. If the student transfers from a school at which he/she was ineligible because of disciplinary action or unsatisfactory conduct, the student will be ineligible at your school for one full semester. If the student participates on a non-school team (i.e. AAU, American Legion, club settings, etc.) that is affiliated with or coached by a coach from a school other than the one the student attends, or has attended, and then transfer to that school, it will be assumed the student has been recruited to attend that school or transferred to that school for athletic reasons and the student will be ineligible there for one year. If the student transfers to a school that his/her coach has relocated to within the past year, it will be assumed the student transferred to that

school for athletic reasons and he/she will be ineligible there for one year. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.4)

7. Must not have successfully completed the eighth grade for the first time more than four school years ago. If the student is a sixth-grader, seventh-grader or eighth-grader, he/she must not have participated in an earlier school year in the grade in which he/she is currently enrolled. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.5)
8. Must be less than 19 years 9 months old to participate in high school; 16 years 9 months old to participate in junior high school; and 15 years 9 months old to participate in middle school. On the day the student reach one of these ages – regardless of when that day is – the student will become ineligible to participate on that level. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.6)
9. Must get signed permission to participate from his/her parents or guardian on a form provided by the school. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.7)
10. Must have a physician’s certificate stating that he/she is physically fit for interscholastic athletic competition. The certificate must be dated any time between May 15, 2002 and one day before participation in the first practice. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.8)
11. Must be an amateur. This means the student must not accept money, gift or donation for participating in a sport, or use a name other than his/her own when participating. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.9)
12. Must not participate in an all-star contest in a sport prior to completing his/her high school eligibility in that sport. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.10)
13. Must display good sportsmanship and follow the rules of competition before, during and after every contest in which he/she participates. If not, the student may be suspended from participation for a period of time. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.11)
14. Must not provide false information to his/her school or to the FHSAA to gain eligibility. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.12)

Appendix B

NFHS Application for Sanction of Interstate/International Event Sanctioning Procedures

NOTE: The interscholastic community urges event sponsors to schedule interstate competition in a manner that minimizes the amount of time student participants will be absent from the regular school day.

1. **Events that Require NFHS Sanctioning:**

(a) Any interstate event involving two (2) or more schools which is co-sponsored by or titled in the name of an organization outside the high school community (e.g., a university, a theme park, an athletic shoe/apparel company).

Competition involving bordering states, and all other configurations of interstate competition not requiring the sanction of the NFHS office, shall be sanctioned by the state associations involved according to their own procedures.

(b) Non-bordering events if five (5) or more states are involved.

(c) Non-bordering events if more than eight (8) schools are involved.

(d) Any event involving two (2) or more schools that involves a team from a foreign country. The host school should complete the international sanction application. (The exceptions to this rule are Canada and Mexico which are considered “bordering states.”)

2. **Request for Sanction:** Only a member school of an NFHS member state association, or a school approved by such an association, or such an association itself, is eligible to request sanctioning through the NFHS Interstate Sanctioning Program. *Any event seeking NFHS sanction must be sponsored by a member high school, approved high school or state association.*

3. **Interstate Competition:** Interstate competition occurs when either teams or individuals who represent their schools travel across state lines to participate in competitive sports events, including but not limited to such events as “shoot-outs,” “showcases,” “round-robin tournaments,” etc. Subject to Paragraph 3, no sanction is required from the NFHS office if all competing schools, regardless of the number of competing schools, are from states that border the host state.

4. **Timelines/Fees:** The application for sanction (Form AT3 for interstate sanction; Form AT4 for international sanction) should be sent to the state association of the host school ninety (90) calendar days or more prior to the event and must be accompanied by the host school’s processing fee of \$75, check or money order, per application made payable to the NFHS. (Do not send cash.) The sanction must be received in the NFHS office sixty (60) calendar days or more prior to the event. The late fee for any event that arrives in the NFHS office 15-59 calendar days prior to the event will be \$25 for a total of \$100. If the event arrives in the NFHS office less than 15 calendar days prior to the event, the late fee will be \$125 for a total application fee of \$200. If the NFHS does not receive the late fees within ten (10) days, the event will not be sanctioned, and the meet director will be notified they are running a non-sanctioned event.

5. **Names and Addresses of Invited/Participating Schools:** All sanction requests submitted to the NFHS office must be accompanied by the names and addresses of all invited/participating schools. In the case of cross country and track & field events, the host school will complete the sanction application and forward it to the host state association office so that it will arrive at the NFHS office 60 days or more prior to the event. The list of schools will be due to the NFHS office ten (10) days prior to the event. If the list is not received ten (10) days prior to the event, the application for sanction will be disapproved, and the meet director will be notified that they are running a non-sanctioned event.

6. **Equal Treatment:** Schools participating in interstate competition, as well as the schools' employees and agents, shall be treated equally. Examples of such shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - (a) reduction or waiver of entry fee for one school must result in a reduction or waiver of entry fee for all schools;
 - (b) appearance fee paid to one school must result in an equal amount of appearance fee paid to all participating schools;
 - (c) expense reimbursements, if any, must result in equivalent payments to all participating schools, subject to reasonable adjustments for differing distances traveled;
 - (d) share of proceeds/gate paid to one school must result in equal share of proceeds/gate paid to all participating schools.

NFHS Bylaw 17 provides that each member state association shall approve and receive NFHS approval for competition by a member school against a school from a foreign country, except for two (2) school and three (3) school competition with a school or schools from Canada or Mexico which necessitates a round trip of less than 600 miles.

7. **NFHS Web Site:** Information regarding the status of an event that has requested NFHS Sanctioning will be posted at www.nfhs.org/sanctioning.htm. If you have any questions regarding the status of your event, please contact the NFHS Sanctioning Department at (317) 972-6900 Monday-Friday, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Eastern Standard Time.

8. **Financial Report:** When NFHS sanction is required, the host school shall submit a financial report about the event to the NFHS on the accompanying form within ninety (90) calendar days of the completion of the event. The FHSAA Office will provide the host school/organization with the appropriate NFHS financial report form once the event has been sanctioned.

If a state association, rather than a school, sponsors or cosponsors the event, it should submit the financial report. For additional financial report forms, contact your state high school association or the NFHS.

Appendix C

Guidelines for Filing of Financial Report and Payment of Revenue Shares

WHO MUST FILE?

Financial Report forms must be filed by the host for all regular season events for which you are required to file a sanction with the FHSAA. Financial Report forms must be filed even if there was no revenue from the event. Forms are not filed in the sports of tennis and golf.

Financial Report forms must be filed for all FHSAA State Series contests hosted by your school.

WHERE DO I LOCATE FORMS AND WHAT DO I ATTACH?

Forms are located in the FHSAA Forms Book and on the FHSAA web site. Please photocopy originals in the Forms Book if more than one form is needed during the sports season.

For district and regional events, the FHSAA State Series Contest Pass Gate Sign-In Form (Form AT9) must be attached to the financial report form before filing with the FHSAA.

WHEN ARE REPORTS AND PAYMENTS DUE AND ARE THERE PENALTIES FOR LATE FILING?

Reports must be **received** in the FHSAA Office no later than three weeks (21 calendar days) from the date of the event. Payment is required along with the report. Financial Report forms received and/or paid more than 30 days from the event date will be subject to a late filing/payment fee of \$50 per report.

WHAT ARE THE RULES REGARDING THE CHARGING OF ADMISSION?

Preseason & Spring Jamborees: The admission price in all sports shall be determined by the host school. **Preseason & Spring Classics:** The admission price in all sports shall be \$4. The host school may request approval for an increase in the \$4 minimum. **Invitational Tournaments & Meets:** The admission price in all sports shall be determined by the host school. **District & Regional Events:** Admission must be charged to all district and regional events in the amount specified in the FHSAA Handbook and sport specific manuals. If the admission price charged is different from what is required in the FHSAA Handbook and sport specific manuals, **written approval** is required by the Associate Commissioner for Athletic Operations **in advance** of the event.

HOW DO I CALCULATE LOSS REIMBURSEMENTS (District and Regional Events Only)

Step 1: Complete the Financial Report form, calculating Total Gate Receipts and Total Expenses. (Excluding FHSAA share.)

Step 2: Calculate Net Profit or Net Loss (total gate receipts less total expenses). (Excluding FHSAA share.)

Step 3: If Net Profit is \$250 or less: host keeps all profit; no disbursement to FHSAA; and no disbursement to visitor(s).

If Net Profit is greater than \$250: pay FHSAA share according to Financial Report form; pay visitor(s) according to Financial Report form; payments to FHSAA and visitors are a percentage of total gate receipts, not net revenue.

If Net Loss is \$250 or less: no disbursement to FHSAA; no disbursement to visitor(s); host school will receive reimbursement from FHSAA for net loss.

If Net Loss is greater than \$250: no disbursement to FHSAA; no disbursement to visitor(s); will receive reimbursement from FHSAA for \$250.

The reimbursement from the FHSAA for losses should be shared with visiting school(s) if an agreement was made in advance to share in a loss from the event.

To receive any reimbursement to which it is entitled:

1. The host school must charge the required admission price;
2. The host school must sell numbered tickets and account for all tickets sold in the ticket manifest section of the financial report form;
3. The host school must file a financial report form so that it is received in the FHSAA Office within 21 calendar days of the completion of the event;
4. The host school must submit with the financial report form the FHSAA State Series Contest Pass Gate Sign-In Log(s); and
5. The host school must be in compliance with all policies for the event.

Refunds of less than \$5 will not be made. Shortages of less than \$5 will not be collected.
